

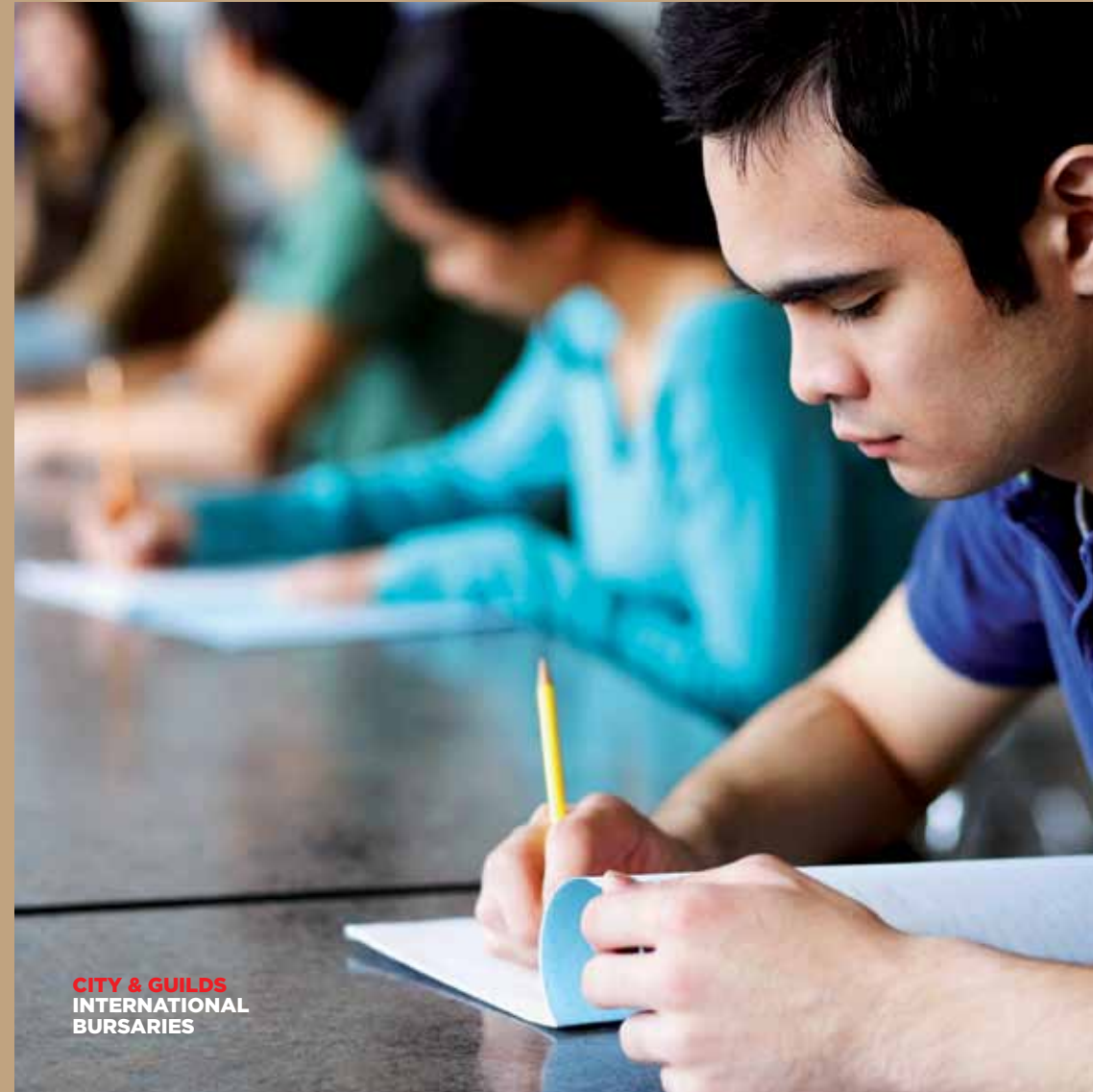

As part of our commitment to the local communities we work with, City & Guilds is launching an international bursary scheme to enable individuals from financially underprivileged backgrounds to obtain a City & Guilds qualification.

What is an international bursary?

International bursaries are granted to cover the tuition and assessment fees leading to the completion of one level of a City & Guilds international qualification. They are available at eligible City & Guilds centres for learners who could otherwise not afford to enrol into a vocational training programme.

Bursaries are paid on completion of the registration process, to the applicants' centre of choice.

Who can apply?

Applicants must meet the following criteria in order to be eligible for a bursary:

- Live close to and intend to study at an eligible centre
- Be able to easily travel to the centre of their choice
- Demonstrate that they would not be able to pursue a training programme unless their tuition and assessment costs were paid
- Complete the application form and interview in English, at a level that is appropriate to the qualification they wish to acquire.

The application process

Potential learners must apply at an eligible centre by completing an application form. Eligible centres may submit a limited number of applications on behalf of potential learners.

Applications will be considered by a City & Guilds Regional Advisory Panel who will prepare a shortlist. Short-listed candidates will be interviewed locally, following which the winners will be chosen and announced.

All decisions are final, appeals will not be considered.

Application timescale

The deadline for submitting bursary applications is 7 May 2010.

Bursary winners will be announced early July 2010.
